## Pittsburgh Botanic Garden Re-opens Permanently April 1, 2015

Pittsburgh, PA., March 24, 2015—The Pittsburgh Botanic Garden re-opens to the public on a permanent basis on Wednesday, April 1, 2015. The garden first opened to the public on August 1, 2014.

To celebrate the re-opening, a Family Activity Day is planned for Saturday, April 4. The event kicks off with an oldfashioned egg hunt for children ages 2-8 from 10-10:45 a.m. Children ages 5-11 and their accompanying adults can test their adventure skills with a nature knowledge challenge. A map and clues will help uncover the secrets of the outdoors at the garden. This event is offered all day during regular hours. Then at noon, a geocaching activity will begin for teens and adults.

On any visit to the garden, guests can enjoy:

- Three miles of groomed trails with a one-mile ADA-accessible trail.
- Family Moments play-and-discover stations to delight children and families.
- A serene lotus pond, brought back to life after decades of pollution.
- The enchanting Margaret Lawrence Simon Dogwood Meadow and Highmark white cedar gazebo.
- Historic farmstead featuring a 1700s log cabin and heritage apple orchard.

Daily hours of operation are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. unless otherwise noted on the website.
